Our national presidential election will occur on Tuesday, November 3. Although many people are apprehensive about the ramifications of this election, we need to remember that God has **“all wisdom and power. He controls the course of world events; He removes kings and sets up other kings. He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the scholars. He reveals deep and mysterious things and knows what lies hidden in darkness, though he is surrounded by light”** (Daniel 2:20-21, NLT).

While we do those things that are within our own power (such as voting), we know there is much beyond our power. We need God’s mercy and favor. Please join fellow Open Bible believers in praying during one or both of our days for the following:

- **For a fresh wave of the Holy Spirit to sweep our nation during such a divisive time. Historically, the darkest periods in our history have been followed by revival and renewal. God can do it again (Psalm 85:6)**
- **That we will humble ourselves and acknowledge our dependency on God (2 Chronicles 7:14)**
- **That believers will vote instead of remaining on the sidelines, and that we would vote from pure hearts, not out of anger or fear**
- **For wisdom as we vote and involve ourselves in the political process (James 1:5)**
- **That we would renew our faith and our trust in God, not in our government or resources we can see with our eyes (Psalm 20:7)**
- **For our leaders to yield personal and political party agendas to God**
- **For God’s mercy, that He would give our next president, whomever that is, Solomon-like wisdom to lead our nation and bless our world**
- **For unity (Psalm 133:1) and healing for the division that is impacting our nation**

In the natural these times can seem overwhelming. Let’s refuse to allow our hearts to be seized by fear and anxiety, because God has overcome the world (John 16:33). None of this is too difficult for Him!
